Paul Roller – Facial recognition has been shut down by several cities; current legislation in the works.

Hiring Trends Discussion

Paul Roller – Their department has only hired sixty-nine officers since 911; it's grim for recruitment; candidates quit or fail during probation; quit during the FTO

program; got sworn in but then started job got stressed, etc. and quit; generational shift in the mindset not desiring a true career; lost staff due to cost of housing in the east bay; agencies could do a better job with recruitment; and, he is in developing a Work Experience and/or Internship program for LPC students.

Bruce Harter – Recommends developing a quasi apprenticeship program, similar to what Kaiser has done in Computer Sciences.

Industry Outlook – no discussion.

POST Rifle Training - Currently, there are no local training opportunities, departments are sending officers to Trinity County. LPC to provide more POST training opportunities.
