#### 4. Community Updates

#### a) ROP sites – Dawn

- 13 at Livermore, 11 at Grenada less working in preschool, more are interested in K-2
- Students are to be back with in school
- More requirements COVID testing and quarantine, sending home to be safe

#### b) Hively

- Trauma-informed care series, monthly training with coaching 2 weeks after each workshop – 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Wed of each month, Started in Sept – June, break in January
- Soft opening of Hively Family Resource Center in Dublin storefront where anyone in the community can get resources, on 7066 Village Parkway in Dublin
- Served double the number of diapers through the pandemic, have a weekly book club for providers and how they can use certain books with the children, Fridays listening sessions for providers throughout Alameda County and how they can be supported
  - o Valley Family Child Care Association most providers are full and enrollment needs are high for infant care, and after-school care, 40 FCC homes throughout the County, work with Hively to help find care when can't meet the needs. We must consider how LPC can support FCC providers? Need evening classes?

- a) ECE instructional program updates Nadiyah, Lyndale, Ana, Laura
  - Fall 21 classes how are we doing?
    - o Enrollments are steady after a drop in Fall 20
  - Equity tutorial program discussion
  - Update on Elementary Teacher Ed program ideas for ECE 10?
    - Surveyed students and there is interest in this new transfer degree.
    - Students will have 54 hours in Livermore primary grades, along with 3 hours of lecture each week.
    - Working on getting the MOU in place and to market the courses
    - Help students to see the connection to elementary education and child development courses – this will help in ROP as well as our courses here at LPC
  - California Early Childhood Mentor Program updates
    - Program is hiring a director and will soon hire an assistant director
    - Under the Department of Social Services and will hope for an update in funding
  - Using more Open-Access resources moving away from high-cost texts
  - What content should we be highlighting in our courses? Tabled
  - Start of new ECE Canvas shell what should we include? Tabled
  - How can we support your programs in hiring employees?
  - CDCT stipends for coursework and work permits
    - $\circ$  Educational support grant \$39 for any unit/class with a C or higher -600 units
    - Only 200 have been claimed so far! It's all online and this is a barrier or some students
    - For those who are working already or those who are enrolled in ECE 90 (even if not working)
    - o Also, can apply for any level of permit to apply or to update
- Learning community/cohorts' updates
  - ECC ELL Cohort Core 13 bilingually in Spanish/English (but open to all) – ECE 62 in Spring
  - Workforce Pathway Working in Alameda County, Zero cost to them, offered 100% in Spanish, ECE 69 for Spring
  - Inclusion cohort Zero Cost to students ECE 60 will be offered in Spring
  - Math cohort students can take college level courses with no prerequisites Math 50 is the suggested one to take ECE numbers have dropped once it was not a closed course to ECE;
     Math 27 is Number Systems for Educators

- Enrollment is up to 63 families, center of choice for children with special needs referrals from all 3 Tri-Valley districts (16 children in pre-k; 10 in toddlers)
- 34 ECE lab students on the Center on a regular basis
- 4 ABA specialists working in the lab
