Report on part-time faculty and staff policy change implications.

The latest data on number of part-time faculty and staff is from Fall 2017, provided by David Rodriguez:

Part-time classified	16
Part-time faculty	239
TOTAL PART-TIME	255
Percentage of LPC staff	54%

^{*}Note: The Office of Research, Planning and Instutitional Effectiveness provides data on staffing every two years.

The full-time totals (verified Fall 2017, provided by David Rodriguez) were:

Full-time classified	79
Full-time faculty	116
TOTAL FULL-TIME	195
Percentage of LPC staff	42%

^{*3%} of staff are administrators

Of a total of 195 possible applicants (total full-time staff), 34 professional development conferences were funded by PDC funds (roughly 17%).

With the same application percentage applied to part-time employees (a conjecture) we would expect 43 applications.

Not every application was for \$500 last year; the average received was \$385.

Model 1, based on a budget of \$12,000, equal distribution:

- \$6480 for part-time
- \$5040 for full-time

Model 2, same budget, 2/3 for full-time; 1/3 for part-time:

- \$4000 for part-time
- \$8000 for full-time

There are other models to consider.
