



# Current Extenuating Circumstances Withdrawal Practice Students may withdraw from a class with extenuating circumstances after the withdrawal deadline date. Circumstances that will be considered include serious medical problem, acute personal or family problem, employment related problem, or other matters beyond the control of the student affecting the ability to complete the course. "W" will be granted only if the petition is approved and the class instructor verifies that the student is maintaining a passing grade of "D" or better (grade "P" in P/NP courses). Students whose request for withdrawal is denied may choose to continue current class enrollment. Extenuating Circumstance Petition forms are available at the Admissions & Records Office.

In January 2018, the Board of Governors passed Title 5, section 55024 regulation changes to add the Excused Withdrawal (EW) symbol. The purpose of the EW nonevaluative symbol is to permit a student to withdraw from a course for reasons beyond their control.

### Similarities between Excused and **Extenuating Circumstances**

LAS POSITAS

- Students must initiate process
- Students must have documentation
- Job transfer outside the geographical region;
  Illness in the family where the student is the primary caregiver;
- An incarcerated student in a California State Prison or county jail;
- The student is the subject of an immigration action; Death of an immediate family member;
- Chronic or acute illness;
- Verifiable accidents; or
- Natural disasters directly affecting the student.
- Financial aid maybe affected depending on individual circumstance
- · FTES can be claimed for apportionment

### Differences between Excused and **Extenuating Circumstances**

LAS POSITAS

- Excused Withdrawal
  - Does not count as an enrollment
  - Does not count in progress and dismissal calculation
  - Student must be refunded enrollment fees
  - Student may initiate at anytime during the semester but not to exceed grade change deadline policy
- Extenuating Circumstance Withdrawal
  - Does count as an enrollment
  - Does count in progress and dismissal calculation
  - Student does not receive a refund enrollment fees
  - Student may initiate after the 12<sup>th</sup> week of the semester but not to exceed grade change deadline policy
