What Is Dual Enrollment?

Dual Enrollment courses provide students with the opportunity to earn college credit while they are in middle and/or high school.

- Dual Enrollment high school students to complete college level courses with their peers.
- Concurrent Enrollment high school students attend courses on a college campus alongside college students.

About AB 288

Assembly Bill 288 (2015) establishes the "College and Career Access Pathways Act" which

 Authorizes California Community College districts to enter into formal partnership agreements with local K-12 districts

"Dual Enrollment" is identified in AB 288 to define "special part-time" or "special full-time" students.

 high school or other eligible special admit students enrolling in community college credit courses.

AB 288 is an option, not a mandate.

College and Career Access Pathway (CCAP) Partnerships

Expands dual enrollment for students who may not already be college bound or who are underrepresented in higher education.

Provides seamless pathways to community college for: CTE or transfer, improving high school graduation rates, or college and career readiness.
