HOW TO USE ASSIST 2012

WHAT IS ASSIST?

- ASSIST is a computerized student-transfer information system that can be accessed on the internet. It displays reports of how course credits earned at one California college or university can be applied when transferred to another. ASSIST is the official repository of articulation for California's colleges and universities and therefore provides the most accurate and up-to-date information available about student transfer in California.
- Articulation: In order to understand what ASSIST is and how it can be used, it is important to know what articulation means. Articulation agreements, sometimes referred to as transfer course agreements, are the official course requirements between Las Positas College [LPC] and colleges or universities which you plan to transfer. Taking courses at LPC that are articulated with courses at a university ensures that you are taking the right courses. Articulation agreements between Las Positas College and University of California (UC) and California State University (CSU) campuses can be found on ASSIT.

ASSIST can be used in two ways:

- 1. ASSIST can be used to find community college courses that are transferable to a UC or CSU campus and how those courses might be used to satisfy specific subject matter requirements for admissions, general education, or lower division major requirements.
- 2. ASSIST can also be used to EXPLORE MAJORS at UC and CSU campuses.

Special Advising Note:

Transfer students are strongly advised to complete as many preparatory courses as possible for their major before enrolling at UC Davis. Preparing well for the major helps students move efficiently toward graduation.

REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMISSION:

Transfer students MUST complete the following required courses or courses listed as comparable to them for this selective major by the end of spring term prior to fall enrollment, with a cumulative GPA of at least 2.90 for the course group. It is recommended that for any of these courses that are completed by the time of application, the GPA for the group be 2.90 or higher and that this GPA be maintained through the transfer academic update filing period. Courses must be taken for a letter grade, with no grade less than C:

> Psychology 1; Psychology 41; Statistics 13; Complete one transferable course in Sociology <u>or</u> Cultural Anthropology One of these two options: Biological Sciences 2A,
